

Bronco rides into Duxford

ON THE STORMY AFTERNOON of September 13, North American OV-10B Bronco G-BZGL arrived at Duxford after a ferry flight from Fassburg, Germany, via Manston, with Belgian owner Tony de Bruyn at the controls. During October another Bronco, G-BZGK, also owned by de Bruyn, is due at Duxford, from where the two ex-Luftwaffe targettugs will be operated by the Aircraft Restoration Company on the European air show circuit during 2002 (see News, June Aeroplane).

The two Broncos were last used at Fassburg by No 3 **Technical Training School for** Battle Damage Repair training. The Luftwaffe operated 18 OV-10s, based at Lübeck, in 1970-90. They were flown by civilian pilots as targettugs and for very-low-level simulated attacks. The type has quite a following in Germany, and in June 2000 the German Wing was the first International Wing of the Bronco Association to be formed.
